



## CAR ASSIST PACK – CARER ASSISTED

The **Car Assist Pack – Carer Assisted** is a selection of car mobility aids that makes a car journey easier for those who need assistance with getting in and out of vehicles.

### CAR ASSIST PACK – CARER ASSISTED **EXPLAINED**

### **CAR SLIDE SHEET**



The **Car Slide Sheet** is a slide sheet designed to help swivel in and out of a car with ease. For use independently or with a carer(s).

**IMPORTANT:** The **CAR SLIDE SHEET** must always be removed prior to the car moving.

#### **HANDYBAR®**



Designed as an aid to stand when rising from a car, the **Handybar®** is a very simple but strong and reliable aid to mobility. Made from forged steel, it simply fits into the door bracket on the cars door frame, where it will then remain for as long as it is needed.



Where lifting legs into a car is a problem, the **Leg Lifter** - **Car** allows users to get in and out independently or with a carers assistance. It can also be used where you need to raise your legs onto bed or even a couch/sofa.

#### SIMPLE WEBBING BELT



If you need to offer more than an arm to support the person you are caring for then this inexpensive medical belt is the ideal solution. The **Simple Webbing Belt** helps a carer to assist patients getting in or out of a vehicle.



This comfortable **HD Deluxe™ Kneela (Round or Rectangle)** provides a cushioning for caregivers who spend a long time kneeling to support patients.

If you work at ground level to help patients in or out of vehicles, this pad will make your life easier.

#### CAR DOOR PULL STRAP



This **Car Door Pull Strap** is for those who struggle to shut their car doors because they can't reach. Suitable only for car doors with an open grip.

Can also be looped through the inside roof handle for extra user support.

### USER INSTRUCTIONS CAR SLIDE SHEET (CARER ASSISTED)





Place the **Car Slide Sheet** on the seat to be used by the person requiring some assistance.

This can be used both on the driver or passenger sides but **MUST BE REMOVED PRIOR TO THE CAR MOVING**.

With the open sides running parallel to the seat, tuck the **Car Slide Sheet** between the back rest and the seat where it will be secured.







The user can then lower themselves onto the seat. They may support themselves by holding onto any part of the car.

The user can then gently swivel around so they are facing front. If they need help with their legs, they can use a **Leg Lifter (LL1550)** to assist – either independently or with help from a carer.





#### REMOVING THE CAR SLIDE SEAT PRIOR TO THE CAR MOVING

Leaning slightly in towards the middle of the car, the **Car Slide Sheet** can simply be pulled gently out from underneath the user's bottom.

The **Car Slide Sheet** can be folded up and placed in the door pocket ready to be used to get out at the end of the journey.

### USER INSTRUCTIONS LEG LIFTER – CAR (CARER ASSISTED)





#### GETTING LEGS INTO THE CAR

**Please note:** The person being helped MUST have sufficient strength to be able to sit unaided on the edge of the seat.

Using the long handles of the **Leg Lifter – Car**, place the strap under the sole of the users feet.

Ask them to sit safely on the edge of the seat.

Adjust the straps to suit in terms of length so that the feet feel supported. Then take both straps in one hand, as shown.

The user can hold the dashboard and use it to support them as you support their feet and as you turn slightly in the car seat, enabling the **Leg Lifter – Car** to support their feet and begin to raise them into the car.







As their bottom swivels around (with or without a turning device), continue to use the **Leg Lifter – Car** to support their feet until it is resting on the floor of the car.

Continue to support their feet until you have it in the right place. Then, release one handle and, pulling on one strap, pull the product from under their feet and back towards you.

# GETTING LEGS OUT OF THE CAR (use the HD DELUXE<sup>™</sup> – KNEELA (ROUND OR RECTANGLE) to kneel on)

Please note: our **HD Deluxe™ Kneela – Round** is used here.

Using the long handles of the  $\mbox{Leg}\,\mbox{Lifter}$  –  $\mbox{Car},$  place the strap under the sole of the feet, not their heels.



Support the feet (not the ankles) with the padded section of the **Leg Lifter – Car**, holding the straps so you do not have to bend or stoop.

Rotate until their feet are safely resting on the floor (the **Car Slide Sheet** is brillant to help their bottom to turn). Remove the **Leg Lifter – Car** and place in the door pocket for next time.




### WIPECLEAN ONLY

Straps can be hand washed gently if necessary


### USER INSTRUCTIONS HD DELUXE<sup>™</sup> – KNEELA (CARER ASSISTED)



Please note: Our **Car Assist Pack – Carer Assisted** may include either our Round or Rectangle Kneela, both are used in the same way.



### USER INSTRUCTIONS HANDYBAR<sup>®</sup> (CARER ASSISTED)





Place the **Handybar®** in the U shaped striker plate on the car door frame and test it is secure.

Use the **Car Slide Sheet** and **Leg Lifter – Car** to help the user to swivel around and move the feet out of the footwell.





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With one hand on the door handle ask the users to place their hand on the **Handybar®** for extra support and steadily stand up. The **Handybar®** will assist your balance while standing.

You may want to use the **Simple Webbing Belt** to help your grip on the user, rather than their clothes.

Once the user is stable the  ${\bf Handybar}^{\circledast}{\rm can}$  be placed in the door pocket for next time.



#### ALTERNATIVE USES FOR THE HANDY BAR

- Side Window Breaker if needed strike the centre of the side window with the pointed end, using a hand snapping motion.
- Emergency Seat Belt Cutter the Handy Bar can also be used to cut seatbelts, remove slack from seatbelt, insert belt into the cutter slot and pull firmly across the body.

### USER INSTRUCTIONS SIMPLE WEBBING BELT (CARER ASSISTED)





Our **Simple Webbing Belt** allows carers to offer greater support for those in their care, whether sit to stand, stand to sit or transferring between sitting surfaces.

Here we show it being used to help someone out of a car but there are many ways it can be used.

Unclip the belt and ask your client to sit forward slightly. Insert the webbing and one buckle end behind the back, as shown.







Clip the two buckle parts together, as shown.

Tighten so it is comfortable.





You can then hold the webbing of the **Simple Webbing Belt** and support your client, not their clothing.

You can continue to support your client, as shown, by holding the **Simple Webbing Belt** at the back.

Please ensure that the **Car Door Pull Strap** is compatible with your car door handle.
